A little girl was walking along the beach. The waves were throwing starfish onto the sand, and they littered the beach. One by one, the girl picked up the starfish and threw them back



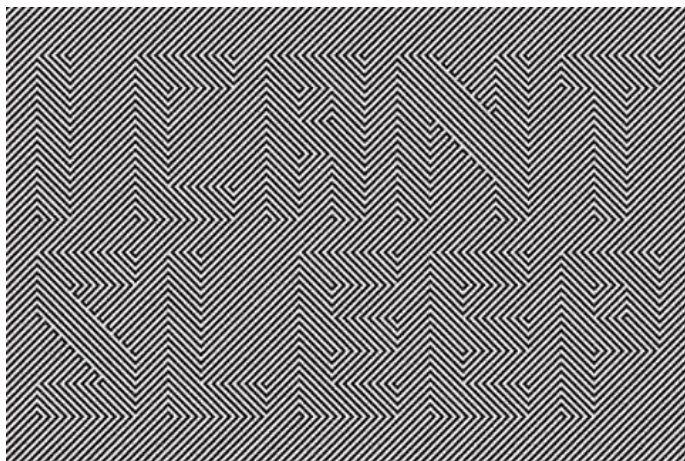
into the water.

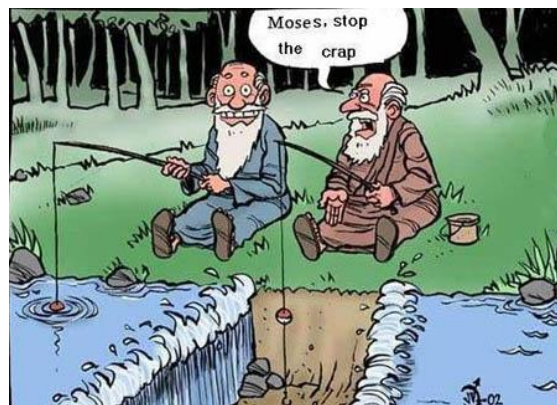
