17. *How can I hold fast to the light when members of my family are in deepest darkness?*

Your thoughts, beliefs and heartfelt feelings are known *only* to you, and therein you can hold your light steady. It may help significantly to silently “endow” darkly inclined family members with light qualities you wish they had. “Seeing” them in the light can negate your feelings of being held back by their dark aspects.

18. Please remember that a family agreement is made with all souls’ unconditional love for each other. Because the agreement is designed to benefit every participant, some are the “heavies” for their own balancing, which enables the others to experience what they need, to achieve balance, and all can move forward in soul growth. None of the participants consciously knows the role he or she chose and all are responsible *only* for their personal decisions and actions. You cannot control the actions of the family members you feel are in darkness, but you can control your *reactions*—reacting within the light lets *light* heartedness flow within and radiate outward to all around you.


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LOT'S WIFE
